



A garden with a modern twist

Opened in 2003, Mount Penang Gardens is an enduring and radical contribution to public garden design in Australia.

Renowned landscape architect Anton James' distinctive 'garden within a garden' design creates an understated imperfect landscape that continues to evolve today.

Modern landscapes and Australian native flora blend together to create amazing seasonal displays. Individual 'gardens' are set on and around a large sculptural plateau with walled spaces, abstract pergolas, fountains, ponds, cascades and a 35-metre cantilevered steel footbridge.

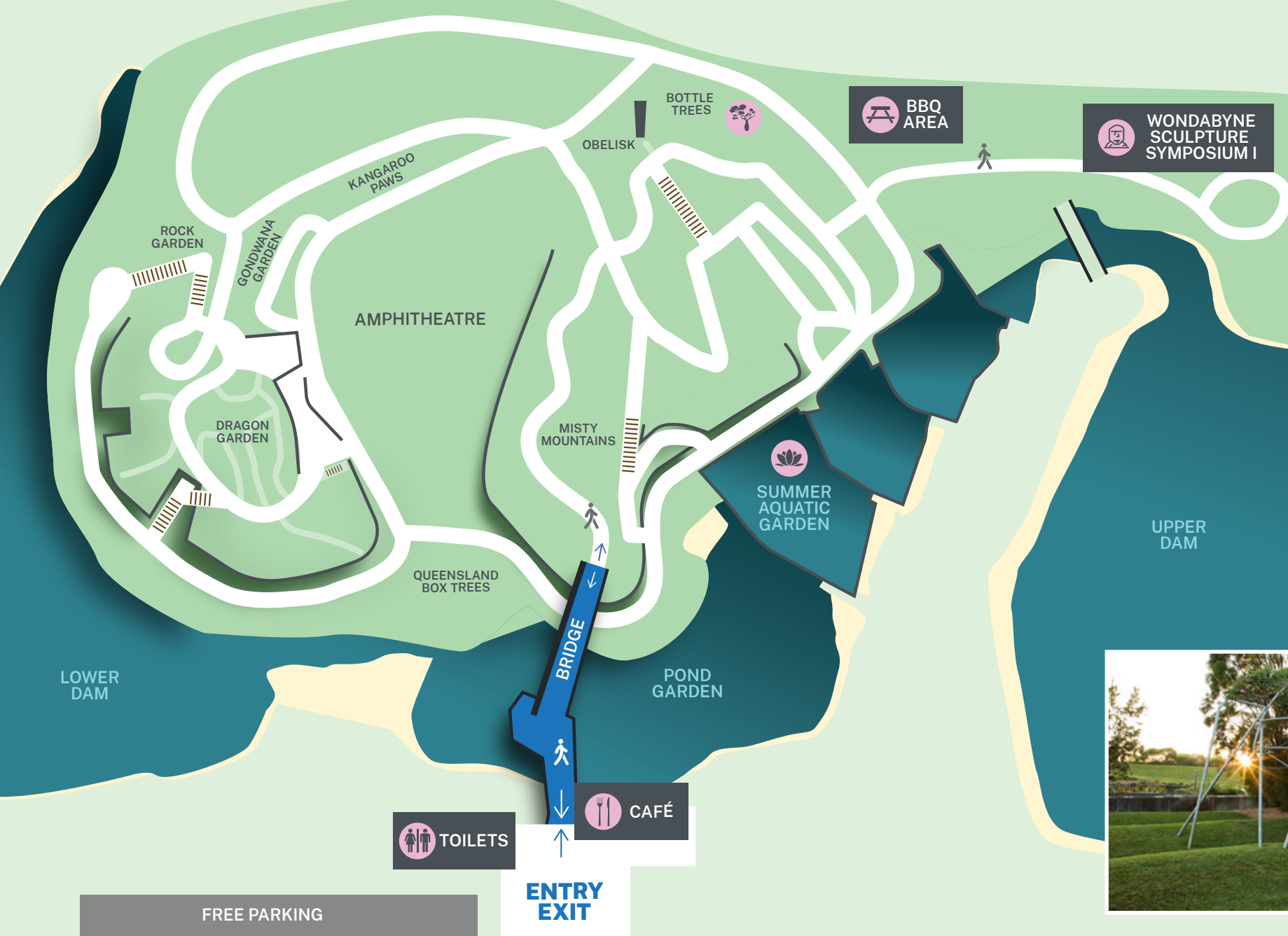

Wondabyne sandstone sculptures

Mount Penang is home to the fascinating Wondabyne Sculptures; a permanent outdoor exhibition that can be found on permanent display in the gardens and surrounding parklands. These massive sandstone artworks were carved when sculptors from around the world came together for 2 International Sculpture Symposiums. Each sculpture carved from beautiful locally sourced sandstone is a unique piece of art, influenced by the environment and the cultural heritage of the artists.

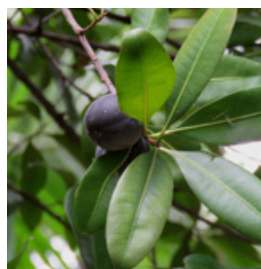
Located within the Gardens, ***Symposium I*** features 12 artworks sculpted waterside at Wondabyne. The artworks, created in 1986, were handed over to the people of Australia as a bicentennial gift.

In the nearby Mount Penang Parklands, ***Symposium II*** showcases another 13 sculptures, carved on site in 1988.



Every pathway is a discovery

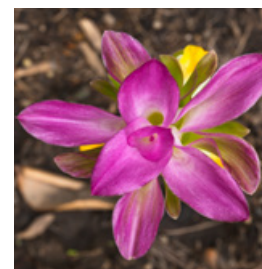

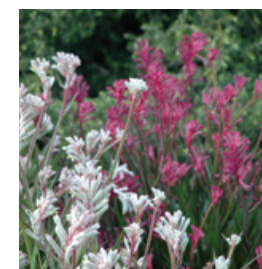

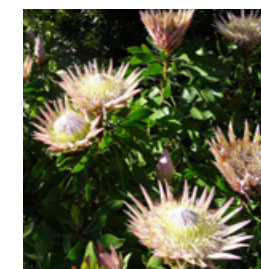

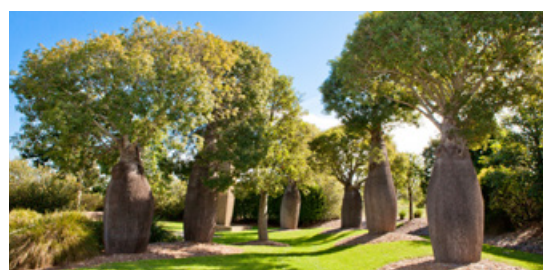

Water features

Mount Penang's ponds, cascades and summer aquatic gardens have natural soil and mud bottoms that encourage plant and insect life. Native fish, including murray cod, catfish, yellow belly and silver perch are all part of the Gardens family, living in the upper dam.

The water used in the Gardens is recycled, collected from the Parklands and stored in the lower dam.



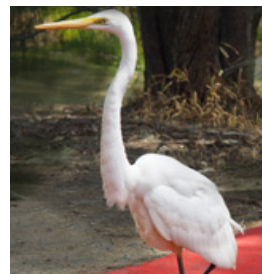
Birds of Mount Penang

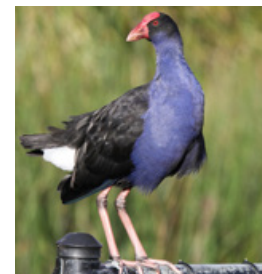
